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




# EXPLORING UDAIPUR CITY


hint of its ancient architecture in every corner which makes this city really pretty.

# FORGOTTEN JAPANESE TEMPLE IN MUMBAI

Mumbai is a city full of hidden gems that constantly surprise you. Serene and quiet in the middle of Worli, one of the busiest parts of town, lies a Japanese Buddhist Temple. Built back in 1952, it was founded by a travelling Japanese monk, Nichidatsu Fujii, in order to spread peace in the city and country and is run through the charity of Seth Raja Baldeodas Birla's family. Dedicated to the Japan Buddha Vihara temple trust, it follows the order of Nichiren Buddhism and the main prayer of this school is 'Nam Myo Ho Ren Ge Kyo', a chant for peace.



The entrance of this temple has a Japanese inscription that reads "Nipponzan Myohoji" which is literally the name of the temple. Just like any other temple you are required to remove your footwear outside before entering it.

As you enter, on your left side you will come across many English and Japanese articles explaining the history of the temple in detail and the Japanese spiritual connection with India. As you move further, you will be greeted by many Buddhist statues, a large Japanese drum which is probably used during the prayers and the interior adorned with paintings depicting the life of Buddha. The main shrine consists of 6 statues of Bodhisattvas and a tranquil white marble statue of Buddha seated in Dharmachakra mudra symbolizing enlightenment. An incense holder in front of Buddha indicating one of the characteristics of Japanese Buddhist temples, shows a perfect amalgamation between the two ancient cultures.

Overlooking the main shrine, there is a small desk where many Sutra books in Japanese were placed along with some non-melodic percussion instruments used for chanting. Prayers are usually held during morning time at 0600hrs as well as evening time during 1730hrs,

While the temple remains open for visitors from 0530-1230hrs and 1530-2000hrs. When I visited this temple back in 2018, I also came around the pillars of the temple where some stickers in Japanese were placed reading food, medicines, stationery, miscellaneous goods etc. indicating the donation activities. Unfortunately, I couldn't meet Morita San, the humble and gracious priest, residing here for many years, dedicating his life to uphold the principles of humanity, especially in these tumultuous times. Nevertheless, I was able to get detached from the chaotic world outside and got lost in the serenity of the place.

It is a relatively small temple but the holy and spiritual vibes here are influential enough to attain inner peace from a tired soul. Soak in the masterpiece of Indo Japanese architecture, where this peaceful sanctuary opens its doors to people of all faiths and the Japanese drum beats blend with sounds of Arabian sea waves paving a way for your connection with this universe.

# STATUE OF UNITY

*The World's Tallest Statue*



## About Statue of Unity

The Statue of Unity is built in dedication to Iron Man Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, who served as the first home minister of independent India. October 31st, 2018, marked the inauguration of the world's tallest statue – the Statue of Unity at 182m, against the backdrop of the dramatic Satpura and Vindhyachal hills in Kevadia, Gujarat. The Statue of Unity overlooks the vast surrounds and the river basin of the Narmada River and the sprawling Sardar Sarovar dam.

## My Trip to Statue of Unity

A weekend trip was planned to Visit The Statue of Unity from Mumbai. I, along with my 3 friends was involved actively in planning the entire trip. It was an overnight journey to visit Kevadia.

The next morning started on the train with the perfect sunrise view from the train with a cup of coffee. We reached Ekta Nagar at 07:20 am. The station was eco friendly & surprisingly the cleanest railway station i have seen till date. It is India's first railway station with a green building certification. Facilities have been installed for water management through rain water harvesting, sewage treatment plant, eco-waterless urinals and drip irrigation. Passenger facilities like air-conditioned waiting rooms and a VVIP lounge have been made at the first two levels of the station. Pre booking the Hotel is highly recommended. After Breakfast we started our journey to the most awaited STATUE OF UNITY which is 6km (15 min) away from the hotel.

We took a bus from Ekta nagar railway station to SOU. Daily buses depart from here to the SOU complex which has a good number of frequencies approx 30 min a bus. Also one can opt to go via auto rickshaw which might be quite expensive. Also one thing noticed here was there are Women E - Rickshaws operated around the SOU.

### [Inside the Statue of Unity Complex](#)

First things first, the statue is truly majestic!! There is a lot of walking involved from the parking place to the statue. We had booked the noon slot to avoid rush hours. The lift to the viewing gallery is super fast and takes you there in the blink of an eye. From the viewing gallery the sheer scale of the project is breathtaking. Later we also visited the base of the statue and the attention to detail will leave you overawed.

The structure is amazingly awesome to behold. It is also scrupulously clean considering the number of people who visit it at any given time. Lots of history to

read and watch so you can spend less time on top and more time in the museum. I never thought that an area where a dam has been made could be developed so beautifully asper with any foreign tourist place . A food court with multiple global and local fast food brand outlets is available. The regular Indian Thali will cost 200/- INR & also one can opt for Western food outlets like Starbucks and Subway. There is ample availability of cold drinking water for both purchase and refill. Area within the monument has ample shading to protect from sun and rain. The monument complex has clean washrooms.

After a delicious meal, we then visited The valley of flowers (not recommended in afternoon hrs) and then proceeded to The Jungle safari. The park is home to more than 186 species of fauna, covering various biomes of Africa, Australia, Asia, and America. Visitors will also be able to spot India's endangered species, which includes the magnificent big cats such as Asiatic Lion, Royal Bengal Tiger, and Leopard. Post the safari we had a small tea break and then we progressed to the most awaited part of our trip which was the Laser show. It showcased the journey of Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel and its role to create India as a nation from various subcontinents. The show uses a statue as a canvas with a beautiful mixture of laser lights, sound, graphics, and storytelling. The 30-minute show leaves the viewers spellbound. There are a total of 51 high-resolution projectors used in the show. All of them are fixed at a distance of 600 meters. It was an evening show,

concluded with The National Anthem.

After the show, we took a bus and got down at Shreshtha Bharat Bhavan where we had dinner and headed back to the hotel and then to the railway station for the return journey.

**TIPS**

- No foods are allowed on Whole SOU premises. Only water bottles are allowed. There is a food court near the entry gate of SOU where you can have some snacks.
- Book Viewing Gallery tickets with a Laser show at SOU campus where you can see and hear properly.
- Avoid Weekends (Saturday--Sunday) due to heavy rush if you want to see and enjoy each n every attraction of SOU and in Kevadia.
- Amul Parlour is situated near Bus Shuttle parking of the Statue of Unity buses in Shreshtha Bharat Bhavan Campus and also near various attractions.
- Visitors can carry back with them several memories of their visit by buying mementos in the form of caps, t-shirts, Statue of Unity replicas, pens, key chains, and notebooks, which are available at the Souvenir Shop located near the SoU and also at several other places at Kevadia.
- The SOU remains closed on Mondays.

**My Thoughts**

I recommend every Indian, whether in India or elsewhere on this globe, must know the strength of our decision-maker who created this marvelous piece on this earth. so covertly and made it to the public for display on grand scale. I cannot imagine any Indian who would not feel proud to know the history of a great leader of the nation and L&T to build this statue. The tallest statue in the world was made in record time to honor the man who unified India once the British left. A truly fulfilling experience and an eye-opening insight into the life of Sardar Vallabhai Patel 'Iron Man of India'.





# A TRIP TO VAISHNO DEVI

## SHRI MATA VAISHNO DEVI SHRINE BOARD (SMVDSB)

The Vaishno Devi Temple or Vaishno Devi Bhavan is widely visited Hindu temple dedicated to goddess Vaishno Devi. It is located in Katra, slopes of Trikuta Hills within the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir in India. Hindus consider Vaishno Devi as an incarnation of the three Goddesses Mahakali, Mahasaraswati and Mahalakshmi. The temple is governed by Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board (SMVDSB), chaired by Government of Jammu and Kashmir.



## THE TEMPLE

This cave temple houses three sacred 'pindis' or stone representations of three energy forms. Interestingly, all the pindis differ in colour and texture despite of having the same source rock. The pale white rock is said to represent Goddess Saraswati, lying on the extreme left, in the middle lies the yellow-red rock denoting Goddess Lakshmi, and the one on the right is black representing Goddess Kali. ## SOME POPULAR STORIES

According to the mentions in Mahabharata, Arjun worshipped Vaishno Devi by the advice of Lord Krishna for the blessings. Pleased by his devotion, Devi appeared in the form of Vaishno Devi. Arjun started praising her with the stotra, Jambookatak Chityaishu Nityam Sannihitalaye, which means 'you who always dwell in the temple on the slope of the mountain in Jambhu' (Jammu) Popular stories tells us that Vaishno Devi was a devotee of Vishnu and she used to meditate in the cave of Trikuta Hills. Bhairav Nath, a Hindu Tantric saw her and chased her. She later cut off his head with her sword in a cave. When he came to know about the Divine Power in front of him, he asked for a favor saying, 'Forgive me for my deeds and give me a place of honor, oh Mother Goddess' to which Devi said 'Visiting my abode alone will not be fruitful until my devotees visit you' Hence, after Darshan of Devi, devotees climb up the hill to visit Bhairav Nath or BhairoBaba.

## MY EXPERIENCE

I had the privilege to visit the sacred Shrine this year in the month of March. I came across numerous devotees who were complete strangers to me yet when they said "Jai Mata Di", they suddenly felt familiar, all of us being the children of Mother Goddess. The atmosphere becomes divine with the 'Stotras' , 'Bhajanas' and 'Aartis' playing on the speakers to encourage the Yatris to keep walking towards the ultimate Almighty. There are two ways to reach up the hill namely Ardhkuwari Marg and the new Tarakote Marg. The Tarakote Marg was inaugurated by PM Narendra Modi in May 2019. It provides a comparatively cleaner and shorter route from Katra to Ardhkuwari..


# KASHMIR- THE PARADISE ON EARTH


## Warm And Friendly Locals





# TREKS, TRAILS & TOURISM


When one hears the word Adventure Tourism or Geotourism, treks and hikes are the first thing that pops in anyone's mind. One of the latest trends in the field of tourism.



कोकणातील समुद्राचे निळेशार पाणी, किनाऱ्यावरील सोनेरी वाळू, फेसळणाऱ्या लाटा पर्यटकांना जास्त आकर्षित करतात. आणि हे समुद्र बाकी समुद्रासारखे वर्दळ असलेले नसतात तुम्हाला तिथे शांतता मिळू शकते. देवगड, तारकली, तोंडवली, मालवण, गणपतीपुळे असे अनेक पर्याय आहेत. पण मला विचाराल तर मी सांगेन की देवगड चा समुद्रकिनारा बेस्ट आहे. एका बाजूला पवनचक्की व त्याठिकाणी जाण्यासाठी खास बनवलेली रूंद घाटी व दुसऱ्या बाजूला देवगड किल्ला व गणेश मंदिर यांच्यामध्ये असलेला समुद्रकिनारा, मनाला थक्क करणारे दृश्य असते. पर्यटकांची पसंतीही सूर्यास्तसमयी या ठिकाणी हजेरी लावण्यासाठी मिळत आहे.

धार्मिक पर्यटन करणाऱ्यांसाठी गणपतीपुळे, कुणकेश्वर, सागरेश्वर, परशुराम मंदिर असे अनेक पर्याय आहेत. गणपतीपुळे व कुणकेश्वर येथे Maharashtra Tourism Development Corporation (MTDC) चे रिसॉर्ट आहेत. तेथे राहण्यासाठी उत्तम व्यवस्था आहे. गडकिल्ले पाहणाऱ्यांसाठी सिंधुदुर्ग, विजयदुर्ग, जयगड, रत्नदुर्ग हे किल्ले आहेत. कोकणात जाण्यासाठी तुम्ही हवाई मार्ग, रस्ते वाहतूक किंवा कोकण रेल्वेने प्रवास करू शकता. पण मी सूचित करेन की, प्रत्येकाने पावसाळ्यात कोकण रेल्वेने प्रवास करावा तो तुमच्या आयुष्यातील खूप सुंदर अनुभव असेल. रेल्वे जेव्हा लांबलचक बोगद्यातून उंच पुलावरून, हिरव्यागार शेतामधून, नद्या नाल्यांना, पार करत जाते, तेव्हा निसर्गातील सारे सौंदर्य पाहून आपले मन भारावून जाते. पावसाळ्यात हिरवीगार भातशेती बघून जणू हिरवा गालिचा पसरला आहे असे वाटते. पावसाळ्यात मुख्य आकर्षण म्हणजे घाटातील छोटे-मोठे धबधबे जे पाहून सर्वांचे मन प्रसन्न होऊन जाते.

# उद्धर रामेश्वर


रामायणातील ही कथा बऱ्याच जणांना माहीत आहे. ही कथा येथे नमूद करण्याचे कारण म्हणजे रावणाने जटायुला ठार करून ज्या डोंगरावरून सीतेसह उड्डाण केले. तेच हे ठिकाण त्या ठिकाणावर युद्धाच्या काही खुणा अजूनही अस्तित्वात आहेत.

रायगड जिल्ह्यातील १४ कि.मी. व नागोठ्यापासून वाकण - पाली मार्गे १९ कि.मी. अंतरावर हे रामेश्वर देवस्थान आहे. ६०० फूट उंच असलेल्या या टेकडीवर ३०० वर्षापूर्वीचे किंवा त्याहून अधिक वर्षापूर्वीचे जागृत देवस्थान आहेत. रामाने हाच ठिकाणी उत्तरकार्य (उद्धर) केले म्हणून त्यावरून गावाला उद्धर व मंदिरास उद्धर रामेश्वर हे नाव पडले. उद्धर हे गाव या मंदिरापासून फक्त दोन कि.मी. अंतरावर डोंगराच्या पायथ्याशी आहे. तेथे ही गरम पाण्याचे कुंड आहे. मंदिरात पिंडी समोर नंदी आहे. त्याला एकाचवेळी उचलला तर मनातली इच्छा पूर्ण होते असे म्हणतात. १६६५ मध्ये हे शिलालेख झाल्याचे समजते. महाशिवरात्रीला येथे मोठी यात्रा भरते आणि हे मंदिर नदीच्या काठावरच आहे. पावसाळ्यात नदीचे पाणी मंदिराला लागते. आणि तिथे दोन कुंड सुद्धा आहेत. त्यात दशक्रिया विधी आणि अस्थी विसर्जन केले जाते.

उद्धर रामेश्वरकडे म्हणून शासनाने जाणूनबुजून दुर्लक्ष केले आहे. या मंदिराकडे जाण्याचा मार्ग काहीसा नीट नाही. आणि गावापासून वस्तीपण लांब आहे. तर खूप पर्यटकांना माहीतच नाही. इथे इतके छान आणि प्राचीन मंदिर आणि कुंड आहेत. तिथे फक्त शिवमंदिर नसून अजून ही बरीच मंदिर आणि त्यांच्या रहस्यमयी कथा आहेत. तिथे गेल्यावर गावकरी भेटतात त्यांना विचारलं की ते सर्व कथा आणि गोष्टी सांगतात. ते सर्व ऐकण्यात पण एक वेगळीच मज्जा आणि उत्साह वाटतो.

मी सुद्धा येथे लॉकडाउन मध्ये गेली होती. तिथे गेल्यावर आपल्या जवळपासच खूप ठिकाण आहेत फिरण्यासाठी हे समजलं. आणि तिथे गेल्यावर एक वेगळीच मनाची शांती मिळते. ते ठिकाण ध्यान करण्यासाठी खूप चांगली आहे. तर हे उद्धर रामेश्वर मंदिर खूप छान आणि रहस्यमय आहे .


